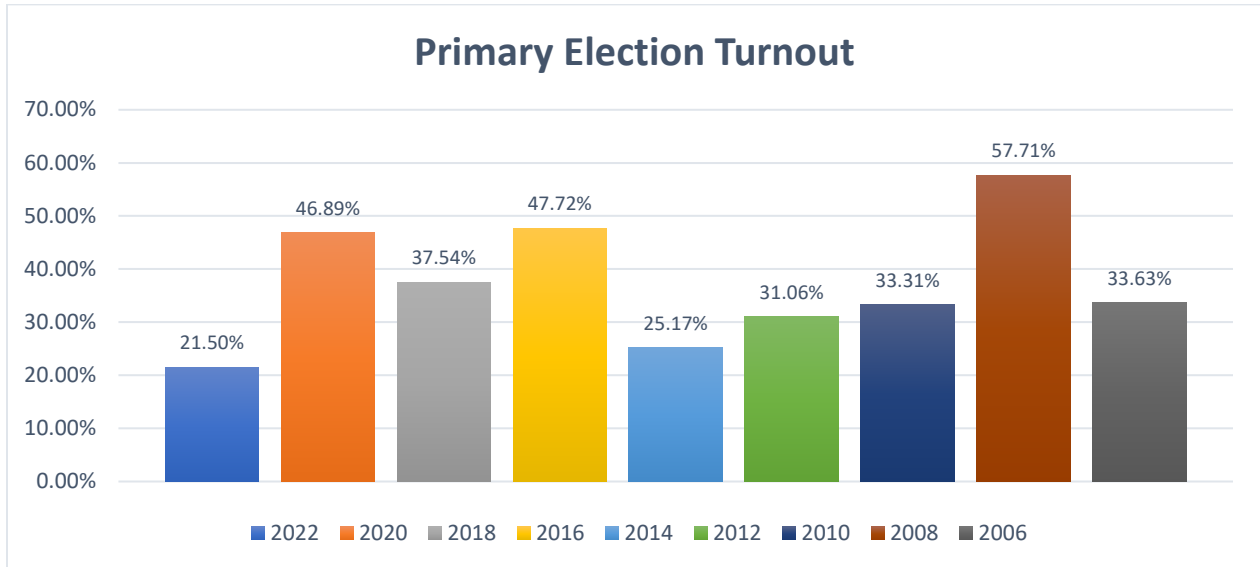


Election Update (As of June 27, 2022)

Statewide 32.7% of the voters cast a ballot in the June 7, 2022, primary election, making it one of the lowest turnout in the past 20 years. Turnout in Los Angeles County was low 28.45%. The 2021 special election to recall the governor saw turnout at 51.9%.



On Friday, June 10th the Los Angeles County Registrar of Votes estimated that there are approximately 506,050 outstanding ballots to be processed.

While there are many ballots yet to be counted it looks like 22 of the 23 LA JOBS PAC endorsed candidates won their race or are in the November runoff.

LA MAYOR’S RACE

In the Los Angeles Mayors race, LA Jobs PAC endorsed candidate Rick Caruso will face Congresswoman Karen Bass. Below is a map published by the LA Times that shows which candidate won the most votes in each Los Angeles neighborhood. From the map, you can see that the majority of the San Fernando Valley, including the highly Latino Northeast Valley voted for Caruso. Bass did win in SFV communities like Studio City and Valley Village. It is also worth noting that de Leon came in second in many of the Northeast Valley Communities.

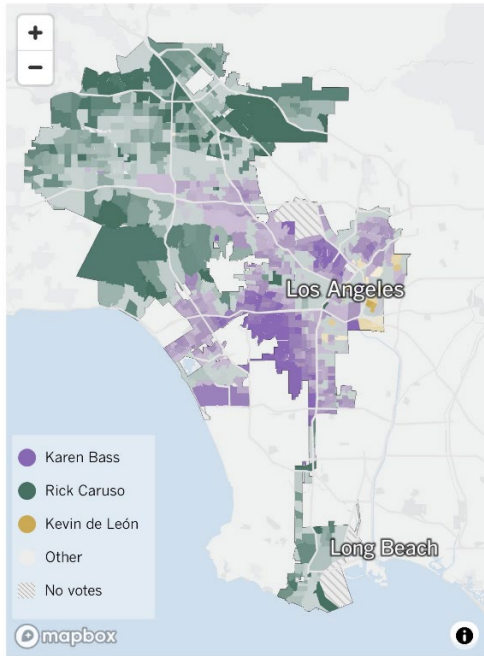
Bass did well in Central and Eastern Los Angeles and split many west LA communities with Caruso.

In the highly Latino “East LA” community that de León won, Caruso and Bass split who came in second.

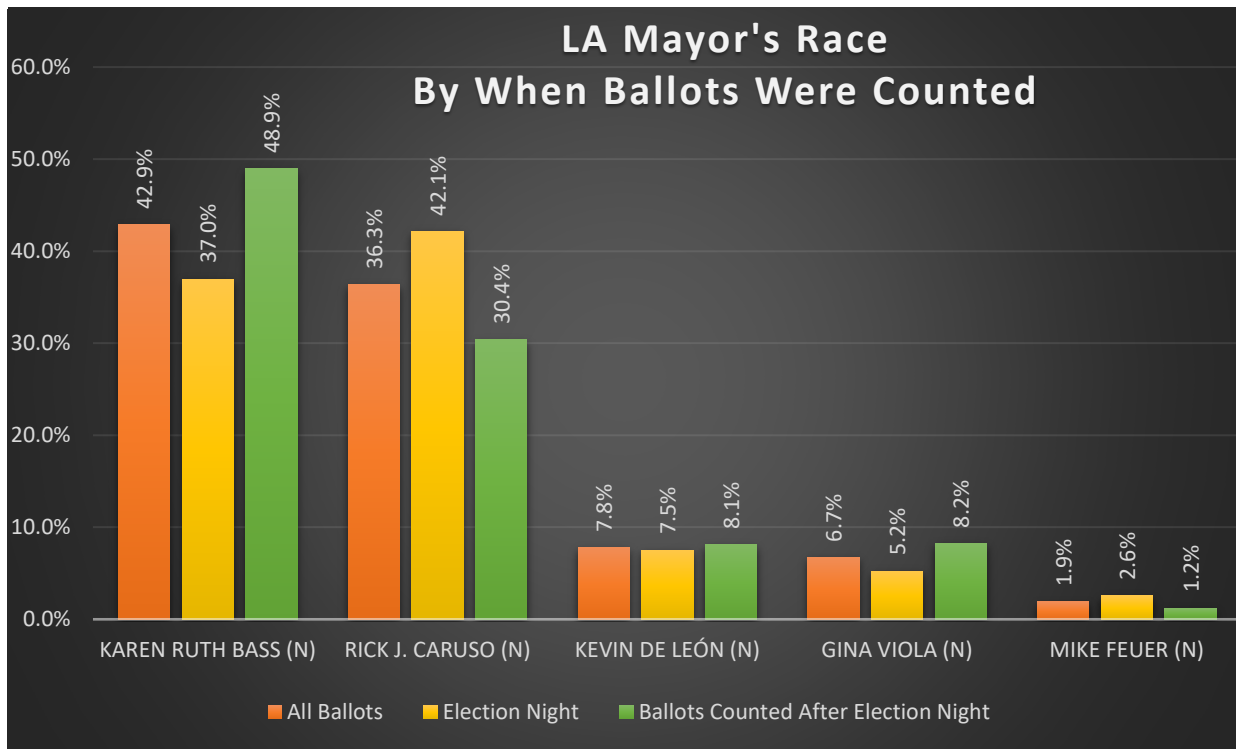
The Latino community is up for grabs. The candidate that wins the Latino vote in November will be the next Mayor of the City of Los Angeles.
