A New Department

For the first time, there is one department in Los Angeles County entirely focused on preventing and addressing homelessness. The LA County Board of Supervisors voted to create the Department of Homeless Services & Housing (HSH) in April 2025, and the department officially launched January 1, 2026.

Our goal is simple and urgent: move people into housing and deliver the services they need while, in the process, earning trust in our communities.



Mission

Together with our partners, we lead a unified countywide response to homelessness that combines housing, health, and social services.
